TODAYS TALK

David Alan Richards is a retired NYC real estate attorney who, amongst other things, negotiated the High Line transaction on behalf of the railroads. He holds degrees from Yale and Cambridge and his Kipling collection at Yale is the world's largest. Last year Richards was honored by receiving a Who's Who Lifetime Achievement Award. He has been a member of the RMA for about 1 year

The presentation gave us an overview of Kipling's literary life and achievements and explored Kipling's long and fateful relationship with America. He was the first English writer to win the Nobel Prize in Literature. Kipling was born in India and lived there as well as in England and America.
