## **TODAY'S SPEAKER**

Dr. Laurence Kantor, PhD, addressed members on the prospects for the economy and markets in light of recent changes in tax, trade and immigration policies. With respect to the recently passed tax bill, Dr. Kantor indicated that, with near-term 2.5% to 3% GDP growth projected, the economy needs "no juice," and the tax plan will adversely impact on our national debt and put pressure on social programs, because there is no way the plan will pay for itself. He suggested that we are at the tail-end of an unusually long recovery from the 2008 recession and that the stimulation effect from that recovery is waning. This will likely lead to a new recession as early as 2020. With respect to

current trade policy, Dr. Kantor seemed to indicate that we are in danger of embarking on an all-out trade war from which no country will gain economically. He suggested that it is too late to fight globalism and that the jobs already lost to other countries will not return, largely because we have ceded some industries to others, but also because ours is increasingly a service economy and technology is replacing human labor. Dr. Kantor suggested that it is a bad time to be "down on immigration." He seemed to indicate that, with retirements high and our national birth rate down, we should be welcoming skilled laborers, who will pay taxes and contribute to economic growth.
