#### **TODAY'S SPEAKER**

Economist Laurence Kantor, in his second appearance as an RMA speaker, covered several economic issues facing the current administration and its impact on the US economy. Of the current indicators, unemployment at 4.3% is low but so is growth at 2%. Labor force is down significantly from the period 1960 to 1990 when it was 2.5% compared to 1% now. Labor force expansion is not matching people going on retirement. On immigration there is a need for more workers to pay Federal retirement and health care costs, and many jobs require skills which are not available. Tax reform both for corporations and individuals is needed to improve the economy and increase the workforce.
