### **TODAY'S SPEAKER**

JIM FISHBEIN introduced Gary Rossi, Vice President of Security at Fidelity Global Security, who spoke on *Practical Tips to Ensure Personal Security and Avoid Cyber Crime*. From the outset Mr. Rossi made us aware of the many ways our personal safety and security is under attack. The average person innocently leaves openings for exploitation by cyber criminals. He said "Dimitri", somewhere in the Baltics, Ukraine or Russia, hovers every moment waiting for the chance to steal passwords, codes, social security numbers, etc. With that information, personal accounts can be invaded, funds can be transferred to untraceable foreign accounts and once secure lives can be destroyed in a matter of minutes.

Mr. Rossi, a former FBI Chief of Undercover and Sensitive Operations unit, detailed the measures to take that will reduce exposure to cyber criminals. Namely:

Freeze your credit

Never use public Wi-Fi

Use a dedicated device for personal finances

Use a two-factor identification

Establish alerts on your accounts

Hire an expert to assess your risk

In addition to financial security, Mr. Rossi stressed the importance of personal safety. He said household help should be vetted and always have good travel medical insurance when traveling. He warned that "Dimitri" is out there, waiting.
