TAD introduced Gabby Rattner, Executive Director of Community Centers, Inc. (CCI) of Greenwich. (TIM NOLAN's wife, Barbara, was Exec. Dir. for over 50 years.) CCI serves the approximately 20 % of Greenwich residents who survive on low or poverty-level income. Services include school-age educational programs and summer camp, services for the elderly and for people with developmental disabilities - all provided without charge. To carry out its program, CCI needs volunteers with financial, social services and (sometimes) legal skills; and also for its school-age homework clubs and youth mentoring. PROGRAM: GEORGE UBOGY announced that this week's program is a panel of 4 doctors: himself, Spike Lipschutz, FRANK SCARPA and John Crowe. JOEL BLUMBERG told us that next week we will hear Dennis Corcoran talk about Induction into the Baseball Hall of Fame.

MEMBERSHIP: HORST TEBBE informed us that 100 men were in attendance, including one guest and one inductee.

TODAY'S SPEAKER

GEORGE UBOGY introduced the "The Doctor Is In", which he moderated. It included himself and Drs. Spike Lipschutz, FRANK SCARPA, and John Crowe.

Dr. SCARPA talked about the history of surgery, from when it was the province of barbers. He is a retired general and vascular surgeon.

Dr. Crowe, a co-founder of ONS, told us that 80-90 percent of orthopedic patients do not need surgery. The decision to have surgery or not should be shared by the doctor and patient. Patients need to ask about the risks of surgery and also of not doing surgery.

On the question of how to choose a doctor if you do not have a recommendation from your primary doctor, GEORGE UBOGY recommends looking for Board certification in the doctor's area of expertise.

Dr. Lipschutz, the physician-in-chief of Greenwich Hospital, recommends that patients ask, "What is important for me to know?" Patients should bring all medications to doctor's appointments. He favors family involvement and support for patients, but not to the point of interfering with care.

GEORGE UBOGY discussed new developments in the provision of medical care. They are Concierge, or "retainer", medicine, and the growing use of hospitalists, i.e. primary care physicians who only take care of patients in the hospital. He also defined "evidence-based medicine", and closed by urging discussing your philosophy for end-of-life care with family members and getting your thoughts into the medical record. These presentations were followed by a Q & A session. It was made clear at the beginning that this was not for treating individuals' medical issues from the podium.
