

VOLUNTEER HOURS: TONY COCCHI reported that for the week ending July 19, 2017, 35 men completed 392 volunteer hours on behalf of outside agencies, and 27 men contributed 163 volunteer hours on behalf of RMA. The most hours, 54, were given by an anonymous volunteer.

SCOREBOARD

GOLF: Facing brutal summer temperatures, 13 players took to the links on July 18, 2017, with two players scoring below 90—RICH BARTHOLOMEW (86) and TONY COCCHI (89). RICH also had the longest drive and was closest to the pin on #15. PETER STEIN was closest to the pin on #7.

TODAY'S SPEAKER

Professor Nelson Tebbe, who teaches courses on the First Amendment and constitutional law, with a special interest in religious liberty, at Cornell Law School, addressed a large and attentive group about "The Establishment Clause of the U.S. Constitution and the 'Travel Ban'". Recruited by his father, **HORST TEBBE**, Professor Tebbe was making his third appearance at the RMA.

He noted that in previous visits, he had reviewed the U.S. Supreme Court's decisions of the previous term, but that this year the cases most interesting to him were two that would be decided in the Fall of 2017. The first issue was the travel ban that had affected travelers from several Muslim countries, blocking them from the United States until their status could be evaluated. The justices will need to decide whether the Establishment Clause of the Constitution, generally characterized as separating Church and State, applies and whether the ban shows animus toward a particular religion. The complicated nature of the issue will remain unresolved at least until the Court makes a decision.

The second case to be decided this Fall is the Masterpiece Cake Shop case, in which the right of LGBT prospective customers of a shop that made wedding cakes will be measured against the religious beliefs of the shop owners, who oppose same-sex marriages. The justices will need to evaluate the claim of freedom of religion as well as that of free speech and to decide which party has the more compelling argument.
