Their efforts shortened the war, saved countless lives, and gave them access to careers previously denied to them. Due to secrecy, this effort was nearly erased from history. Now it comes to life in this riveting and vital story. The book can be obtained through the Greenwich Library, where the author, Liza Mundy, will be present on Wednesday, November 7<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 PM. Likewise, the RMA will feature "*Code Girls*" and the GRT on Guest Speaker program on October 24<sup>th</sup>.

#### **TODAY'S SPEAKER**

JERRY SCHWENDEMAN introduced Dr. Martin Tran Nguyen, who provided a brief overview of "Islam: Its Faith, Culture, and Place in America." He is an Associate Professor of Islamic Religious Traditions in the Department of Religious Studies at Fairfield University. He is a scholar of the Qur'an, the religious text of Islam, and has studied the traditions of its scriptural interpretations. Professor Nguyen has a Master of Theological Studies from Harvard Divinity School and an M.A. in history and a Ph.D. in Middle Eastern Studies and History from Harvard University.

Dr. Nguyen explained that the Muslim community consists of 80 to 90 percent Sunnis and 10 to 20% Shias. Likewise, he discussed the fact that while the word Islam means submission or surrender, he prefers the word "commitment" to define the religious connotation of Islam. Sunnis believe in the Qur'an while Shiahs believe not only in the Qur'an but also in Muhammad the Prophet and the line of Imams. These are the fundamental religious differences between the two groups. However, the true differences also include various geopolitical and economic issues. There are 1.8 billion Muslims in the world or about 24% of the world populations. In the United States, there are 3.45 million Muslims or about 1.1% of the population. However, just as with Christianity, some are Muslim in culture only while others are strict religious Muslims. It is the world's fastest growing religion. Muslims originally migrated to the United States between 1701 and 1810 as part of the transatlantic slave trade. The Qur'an consists of 114 Chapters, but they are not linear, chronological, thematic, or stylized. It represents random conversations with God as transmitted through Muhammad. The presentation was followed by a spirited and interesting question and answer session.
