TODAY'S SPEAKER

GERALD POLLACK introduced **Jonathan Chanis**, Ph.D, an economist specializing in political science on the faculty at Columbia whose topic was "Economics and Fossil Fuels". Fossil fuels were formed over millions of years ago and consist of coal, natural gas and petroleum. Professor Chanis asked us to focus on those three over a future time period of 30 years. The future of coal is bleak due to high greenhouse gas and air polluting emissions even though it is still very cheap. The 13% decline in carbon over the past several years in the U.S. has been promising. Increased use of natural gas is being predicted due to its low cost and abundance. Use of alternative energy sources such as solar and wind is still in its infancy but will increase in importance as the technology improves and they become cost competitive with fossil fuels. Unfortunately, nuclear power is in disfavor but should be a major component of our energy mix. One of the most important developments needed for control of climate change/global warming is the development of advanced technology batteries for electricity storage, even for airplanes.
