TODAY'S SPEAKER

BOB ROBBINS introduced Barbara Ormerod-Glynn, Director of the Greenwich Libraries. The subject of her talk, "Greenwich Library in the Digital Age", addressed the conundrum of the modern library; The steadfast reliance on the printed page and the increasing use of digitized material. She summarized this widening gap as "Bookbooks vs. E-books". Yet this activity is only a small part of the evolving modern library. No longer a convenient facility for media, libraries have become community centers, offering a free and vital resource open to the public. No better example is the Greenwich Library System.

Ms. Ormerod-Glynn stressed the assets which have earned Greenwich Library its Five-Star rating. It contains:

- 450,000 items for use by residents
- 14,000 audio books
- 35,000 DVDs which far exceeds Netflix's total
- An embedded art museum, the Flynn Gallery
- 100 computer terminals and Wi-Fi access.
- 1,800 cultural programs a year
- Digital content available 24/7
- The Cole Auditorium, 19 study rooms and a meeting room

Despite the many values inherent in these extensive resources, one stood out. During Hurricane Sandy, with extensive power failures throughout the town, residents gathered in the library, finding comfort and reassurance in its stable environment.
