TODAY'S SPEAKER

TODAY'S SPEAKER was Aleksandr Y. Troyb, Esq. He spoke in great detail about immigration. He told us who is coming illegally and why. Immigrants come

mainly from Central America via Mexico, and from the Philippines Islands, mainly because they fear the violence and crime in their own countries. He said that there is no legal pathway for the vast majority of "intruding" immigrants, and traditionally there are long waiting times stretching for up to 24 years. There are exceptions made if the immigrants are talented athletes, professors, physical therapists, scientists, etc. Anyone willing to sponsor these exceptional persons must have an income high enough to ensure that they don't become a burden on the economy. On the other hand, low skilled workers are valuable to work on the farms at harvest time. Future legislation may focus on protecting border guards, more than 700 more miles of border fencing, increasing training of border officers and scaling up the prosecutions of illegal border crossings. A spirited Q and A followed.
