TODAY'S SPEAKER

Rear Admiral John F. Weigold IV was assigned to his current role as reserve deputy commander, U.S. Pacific Fleet in December 2015. He is a graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy, the Naval War College and the Joint Forces Staff College.

An exceptionally large audience learned about the history and linkages of the Indo-Asia-Pacific region through which passes a third of the world's trade. Sixty percent of the U.S. Navy-- 140,000 personnel -- is assigned to this area. International Naval activities are guided by traditional laws and agreements. Current concerns in the South China Sea result from China's efforts to change these rules. U.S. operations are largely based on old technology. Bringing them up to date is a slow process. China is catching up rapidly.

North Korea is very difficult to infiltrate. It is difficult to figure out what they will do, and we have been forced to take a defensive posture. Much of our effort is focused on building relationships with other nations in the area.

Admiral Weigold's impressive knowledge and experience were greatly appreciated.
