TODAY'S SPEAKER

Dr. Joonun (Chris) Choi, Head of Cardiology at Stamford Hospital, explained seven basic factors to watch: blood pressure – the most significant risk factor; cholesterol level; blood sugar level; level of activity; healthy diet; weight control; and abstinence from smoking. Heart disease accounts for one of three deaths in the U.S. American culture is the underlying cause of obesity -- a major problem. Awareness of unusual debilities is key to early detection of a stroke.
