TODAY'S SPEAKER

Francis Morrone, architectural historian, critic, and preservationist, provided members with a review of Greenwich's significant architectural landmarks, focused in large part, on how these structures reflect the best work of some of the leading architects of the last century. At the outset Mr. Morrone said that he tends to focus on what he calls the high streets of our cities and that his goal was to give us an appreciation of some of the quality architecture found in Greenwich. Some of the buildings he described were the Post Office downtown, whose designer, he noted made the decision to place an obelisk in front of the building, which perfectly fits with the building's curved entryway. He noted the "exceptional" iron work at the entry to the Old Town Hall, and how that structure differs in style from the Havemeyer School building across the way, and how well the styles of the buildings complement one another. Mr. Morrone noted the similarities in the styles of the current Town Hall (formerly Greenwich HS) and the Cos Cob School, noting that those similarities reflect the architect's focus on school design. He spent considerable time on the contributions of Alfred Bossom, who designed the Greenwich Savings Bank building and what he described as the beautiful models and clock over its entrance. Mr. Morrone's architectural tour included other significant buildings including St. Mary's Church (nice, but not great), The Putnam Trust Building on Greenwich Avenue and the YMCA Building.
