Using visuals, he described the classes of submarines used by the Navy and how the fleet will change in future years. Captain Lahti's comment also reminded us of the dedication and service provided by men and women who volunteer for submarine duty. Clearly, describing long underwater deployments, screening of personnel, fighting for budget money and knowing that the length of time a submarine hull is serviceable (43 years) all added interest to his remarks.
