HUMAN INTEREST STORY: As told by **FRANK SCARPA**, he developed a "love-hate" relationship with helicopters arising out of his military service during the Vietnam War. At age 28 while interning in surgery after graduating from the John Hopkins School of Medicine, the War had heated up and surgeons were needed. **FRANK** was claimed by the U.S. Army Medical Corps and assigned to Southeast Asia. He served first as a junior surgeon at a Field Hospital and then as a Brigade Surgeon for a Light Infantry Brigade. Both assignments required a lot of time in helicopters, either accompanying seriously wounded soldiers or on checking up on other doctors at battalion "fire bases". **FRANK's** last involvement with helicopters occurred during the morning of 9/11/2001 when physician volunteers were being sought to travel by helicopter to the World Trade Center site. **FRANK** volunteered. On this day, the eighteenth anniversary of that tragic day, he described the horrors that he witnessed and the emotions he felt at ground zero.

TODAY'S SPEAKER

Asha Rangappa has titled her talk *Information Warfare and Social Media: Preserving Democracy in the (Dis)Information Age.* Ms. Rangappa gained her expertise on the subject when she served as a Special Agent in the New York Division of the FBI,

specializing in counterintelligence investigations, assessing threats to national security, conducting investigations on suspected foreign agents, and performing undercover work. In 2013 a Russian General, Valery Gerasimov, developed The Gerasimov Doctrine, a *Smart War* concept that called for creating chaos and upending domestic affairs without firing a single shot. Russia tried out the *Smart War* measures in the Ukraine and Estonia. In 2016 they used the four active measures, set forth below, with the aid of the internet and social media, such as *Facebook, Twitter*, and *Instagram*. Russia's use of Psychological Warfare to create chaos and subvert the democratic system occurred on four fronts: (1) Hacking and Intrusion; (2) Illegal Campaign Contributions; (3) Political Influence - getting people to present the Russian viewpoint; and (4) Disinformation and propaganda. The current political polarization has served Russia's purposes.
