TODAY'S SPEAKER

JOHN CARON introduced **Ajit Huthseesing** who is a graduate of both Cambridge University and Columbia Business School. After growing up in the well known Nehru family in India, Ajit led a career with major investment banks and founded International Capital Partners. Telling us that he would be viewing the past, present and future of the country, he asked that we consider the three major elements of India's history: industrial power, philosophies and colonialism. Growth in India's past from the 17th century grew from its welcome spirit and its ability to encourage local manufacturing followed by exporting to Europe. At the same time, it was impinged by misdirected socialism and corruption by many of the ruling class. As we look at the present, he told us, we see a country 1/3 the size of the U.S. but with four times the population. The future of the country can be quite positive with the present prime minister but steps must be made to reduce political and commercial corruption. Thirty % of the executive staff in Silicon Valley are from India. Finally, when asked a question about the most successful exports

of India, Ajit replied, "meditation and yoga"; a good answer about potential and perspective that will aid us all in the future.
