RMA Program Presentation Survey Results September 2019

1. Generally, there is strong support for what the Program Committee is doing in delivering speakers. All three presenters from the last three weeks (not today's on Shakespeare) got favorable readings. (Rangappa, Haynes and Albertson) all got solid positive votes. Rangappa edged out Albertson but Haynes, with the Merritt Parkway program, also earned good feedback.

Participants were asked to rate the last three week's speakers in term of how they liked them generally. #1 was a strong positive followed by #2 above average and #3... okay but not terrific.

The raw results follow:

- 2. Just taking the #1 votes (really liked) and comparing them with the #2 and #3 votes, you can see the Committee is delivering really well liked speakers. Even if a respondent did not a vote #1 from someone, there is a solid set of #2 votes.
- 3. If you look at these results with colored glasses, you will see that while the speakers touched on general history (Parkway), political history and an historic Russian figure (Albertson), RMAers did not shy away from the Stalin topic. And, most importantly, we demonstrated that our members can tolerate...and have interest in... current controversial topics...like tampering with the internet and American politics, (Rangappa).

Note: While not studied, my guess is that today's speaker on Shakespeare would have scored just as well as the three surveyed above.

4. As a personal note, Uhry is most interested in the favorable acceptance of what Rangappa said since it suggests that when we talk about "Challenges in Education - separating fact from fiction in a digital age" on October 16, we can almost talk about the threat and harm of "fake news" without specifically saying it for RMA political reasons.

The high quality of speakers that the Program Committee is finding certainly was reflected with the good feedback we got today. Hollister deserves a special round of applause.
