TODAY'S SPEAKER

Donna DeVerona Pinto held the world's record in the 400 Meter Individual Medley in swimming at age 13, won her first Olympic Gold Medal at 17 and later became one of the first women sportscasters on network television. Not content with these accomplishments she became a champion for women athletes around the world and Title IX. Her talk was unusual for an RMA speaker. RMA member **DAVID WEISBROD** interviewed Ms. Pinto and she replied, ad lib, with some accompanying slides. The talk focused on three areas; her life as an athlete, her life as a sportscaster, her life as an advocate for women athletes and securing their place in the world of sports and compensation. Her answers were peppered with personal anecdotes sprinkled with contacts with people whose names we all know. She was warmly applauded at the conclusion of the interview.
