# **TODAY'S SPEAKER**

George Jepson grew up in Greenwich and graduated from GHS in 1972. As a Democrat, however, he thought it best to leave town to pursue his political career, and ended up friends with Dan Malloy and, subsequently, as Attorney General for Connecticut. His office hires 210 lawyers and handles 54,000 cases and that's only civil cases.

George said maintaining the office's credibility was his most important task and that is why he always tries to work with both parties to achieve a solution without having to go public with a press conference about indictments.

He believes a culture change is the only way to solve the scourge of gun violence in our country, citing the example of a woman saying she would not go out with a man unless he locked up his guns or otherwise made them safe and secure.
