TODAY'S SPEAKER

ARNOLD GORDON introduced **David Gilbert**, Musical Director of the Greenwich Symphony Orchestra, whose topic was "The Life of a Conductor". Mr. Gilbert was the winner of the prestigious Dimitri Mitropoulos Conducting Competition. This achievement led to multiple conducting offers. Among them was the American Ballet Theater. An accomplished flutist, he joined the US Marine Corps Band where he played for four years. Mr. Gilbert was quite informative regarding the history of conducting and the intricacies of leading an orchestra. He recounted an incident that challenged his conducting skills. In China, the soloist, the wife of a dissident, under stress, inadvertently skipped three pages of the score. Mr. Gilbert cleverly signaled the orchestra in a discreet manner to bypass the same three pages. Thus, he brought the orchestra in sync with the soloist. At 81 years old, he is still vigorous and remaining actively conducting with a continuing love for music.
