TODAY'S SPEAKER:

John Markoff, Pulitzer Prize winning reporter for the New York Times and author of the book, *Machines of Loving Grace - Between Humans and Robots*, discussed the evolution and impact of robotics over that last half-century, as the application of artificial intelligence allowed the development of machines that could replace many human activities, such as assembly line production. Markoff noted that, out of the emergence of robotics, the idea of a driverless automobile arose and that, several organizations are racing to perfect such a car. Markoff suggested that robotics will have an impact on society that will be greater than the impact of the personal computer and the internet.
