VISITING: **MICHAEL AMBROSINO** told us that **JOHN KNIGHT** had a setback from his hip replacement surgery with an infection and a necessary graft to his hip muscle; but he is now recovering well at home and expects a full recovery soon.

PROGRAM: **BOB ROBINS** urged members to stay for today's special program, a piano concert by Randall Atcheson, music director at First Presbyterian Church and a popular world-class performing artist. **ARNOLD GORDON** informed us that next week we will hear from Curtis Fisher, Executive Director of the National Wildlife Federation's northeast region, on *Offshore Wind Energy in Connecticut and Beyond*. He will review

the economics and pros and cons for its use as a technology to address the impact of fossil fuels on climate change. Come to the talk and be blown away!

#### TODAY'S PERFORMER

**BOB ROBINS** introduced Randall Atcheson, a Steinway artist who has performed as conductor and soloist on five continents. He has a versatile repertoire encompassing classical, pop, and gospel music; he frequently plays gospel across the country. Randall has been a guest soloist with numerous orchestras, here and abroad. With a nearly full sanctuary, he opened his program by asking everyone to rise and sing the *Star-Spangled Banner* to his virtuoso rendition on the piano. Then without intermission, he played a challenging program of classical pieces: J. S. Bach's Partita in B-flat major, the Chopin Sonata in B-flat minor ("Funeral sonata"), two Scriabin Etudes (C-sharp minor and D-sharp minor), and a bravura finale, Liszt's Hungarian Rhapsodie No. 6. After a standing ovation, he played as an encore his arrangement of a medley of the US military branch theme songs and ended with *God Bless America*. Randall will celebrate his 14th concert at Carnegie Hall on Wednesday, November 6th at 8pm.
