TODAY'S SPEAKER

Prior to his speaker introduction, **HORST TEBBE** asked for a moment of silence for all those who have recently been victims of hatred and violence throughout our nation. **HORST** then introduced Dr. C. Griffith Mann, a graduate of Greenwich High School. He is now the Michael David-Weill Curator in Charge of the Department of Medieval Art, at both the Cloisters and at the main collection at the Metropolitan Museum of Art. The history of the collection at Fifth Avenue goes back to the 1870's and to a donation by J.P. Morgan, an avid collector of European decorative art and of medieval art. The Cloisters, located in Fort Tryon Park in upper Manhattan, was constructed on land owned by the Rockefeller family, and its original collections were the gift of John D. Rockefeller. Dr. Mann presented an excellent illustrated description of the artistic highlights and history of the collections at both locations and of the beautiful gardens and facilities of the Cloisters. His presentation was greatly appreciated.
