

TODAY'S SPEAKER

Beginning at 11:00 am sharp, **PETER UHRY** introduced the day's featured speaker, Marc Jaffe, Chief Executive Officer of the Children's Learning Centers of Fairfield County. Marc graduated from Columbia University where he earned a BA in political science and a law degree. He has held executive positions in publishing across many media, including computer software, videogames, ebooks, and publishing, for companies including Vizacom, Simon & Schuster and Rodale Press. He has worked for years with the Harlem-based DREAM Charter School youth program, providing opportunities for, and recognizing individual potential of, inner-city youth. For the last seven years he has been with the CLC.

CLC is a multi-location resource designed to prepare a child for the educational process. Beginning with infants as young as six weeks old, CLC works to empower children with the tools to ensure readiness for traditional schooling.

Among the points made by Marc were that (1) there is a dramatic shortage of early educational opportunities, especially for children under three years of age; (2) this is despite the fact that 90% of brain development occurs before the age of five; (3) CLC of Fairfield serves 23,000 children aged six weeks to five years, at numerous locations; (4) CLC not only prepares the youngest children for further education but also allows their parents to work; (5) CLC is more efficient than the government at this work; (6) CLC primarily feeds students into the Stamford Public Schools and Stamford's Waterside private school; (7) there is a quantifiable ROI (return on investment) in terms of improved performance of the students during their later educational years; (8) the CLC is currently under considerable financial pressure, due to

the COVID pandemic which has caused some locations to close, and caused funding (67% from the government) to dry up. CLC is, he emphasized, under resourced.
