#### **MEMORIAL**

## RMA ANNUAL AWARDS - MEETING VERSION

**PETE UHRY** recalled that at the banquet last week certain members were recognized with certificates for service and volunteer hours. For those members who were not at the banquet, they were recognized from the podium.

**PETE** recognized the two awardees for the Outstanding Service award: **ARNOLD GORDON** - who has in addition to serving on the Board, been a member of the Program Committee, a CBB scribe and an Hours Recorder has served as unofficial Entertainment Chairman, organizing the Corresponding Secretary/Weakly (sic) Jokester effort, the Limerick Contest and Christmas meeting entertainment.

**CHET RISIO** – who was once the CBB Editor and introduced graphics to the CBB. He then created and has Edited (managed) the Member Profiles program, giving members a better chance to know one another. There have been 33 to date, and more on the way. # **TODAY'S SPEAKER**

Henry Dorochovich gave a very sobering talk on climate change. He cited a statistic that we are pouring 110 million tons of man-made pollutants into the atmosphere every 24 hours. He showed that the rate of world-wide temperature rise and CO2 in the atmosphere since the 1940's has far outstripped the rates of the previous almost 800,000 years. Some interesting science involved there. The military seems to be the only government agency that is taking all of this seriously. They are concerned about sea-rise at naval facilities and the effects of extreme storms, which are becoming more common on military installations of all kinds.

He introduced the idea that one of the implications of climate change could affect the "hospitality for human inhabitance" of areas of the world that would suffer from famine and drought due to climate change. This would lead to the need for mass migration to find climate friendlier places to live, putting a strain on less-affected regions.

His talked centered on the issues, impacts, and implications of climate change. He didn't talk much about "what can be done" to stop or slow climate change. That's another talk for another day. His talk was followed by a spirited RMA Q&A.
