TODAY'S SPEAKER

Ken Borsuk, Greenwich Time reporter, shared with members a brief history of Greenwich's local daily newspaper since its inception as the *Observer* in 1877 through multiple name changes until it became the current *Greenwich Time* in 1937. Ken noted he came to Greenwich in 2000, when he accepted his first reporting job with the *Greenwich Post*, a job he held until the *Post* folded in 2015, at which time he joined *Greenwich Time*. Ken noted a reporter's job requires 24/7 availability to cover events and meetings occurring at virtually any time. He indicated that this commitment is partially responsible for high turnover of reporters and editors. Ken described his daily routine as beginning with a morning meeting where reporters suggest two stories for the day, one front page and one inside. Frequently these stories focus on the local impact of national news. An afternoon meeting focuses on the final content of tomorrow's paper to ensure a 5:00 PM deadline (the earliest Hearst deadline) is met. Events occurring overnight are immediately reported on the paper's web site and fleshed-out in the next newsstand edition. Overall, Ken gave members an insightful look into the hectic life of a news reporter.
