Kevin Peraino, veteran foreign correspondent, spoke about his new book "A Force So Swift: Mao, Truman and the Birth of Modern China, 1949". Americans who were in China in 1949 tell us that they have been recalling it vividly, and that there are no good solutions to our relationship toward China even today. At that time, Truman decided it was much more urgent to rescue Japan from its destruction, and rebuild it, than it would have been to rebuild China--- and to rebuild Germany. Both nations are firm allies and supporters of U.S. policy today.
