

Ms. Evelyn Farkas, former Assistant Secretary of Defense for Russia/Ukraine, provided us with a comprehensive picture of Russia's political, economic and military posture in the world today. Among President Putin's key objectives are maintaining internal order, keeping the existing political and economic system in place, and enhancing Russia's geographic control in relation to bordering states. To support these objectives, Russia is modernizing its military and cyber-warfare capabilities. In the course of an extended question and answer session Ms. Farkas commented on a broad range of issues regarding the Ukraine, the Baltic countries, the Middle East, and the Philippines.
