TODAY'S SPEAKER

ARNOLD GORDON introduced Joel Seligmann, a professional photographer and educator who spoke on "Mining, Refining and Restoring Photographic Images in the Digital Age."

He spoke about the evolution of photography from film to digital media, which is now ubiquitous. He called the digital revolution as equal in cultural impact as Gutenberg's printing press. A recurrent theme was "take lots of pictures". Adherence to this motto results in large numbers of images and "how do you store, and catalog them? He suggested a program called "Lightroom" by Adobe.

He mentioned other uses of digital photography, a basic tool for Google Maps and weather study and more.

Joel demonstrated the results of editing several images, to remove unwanted elements, or improve lighting or combining images. He uses Photoshop by Adobe for editing.

An informing and stimulating talk was followed by a short, but brisk Q & A
