Book Review: AV RIVEL offered a review of the book, *Deacon King Kong*, by James McBride. The story takes place in Brooklyn in the 1960s, when a shocked community learns that a respected deacon of a local church has shot a teenager in a public place. A cast of Damon Runyon like characters searches for the deacon's motive for the shooting and discovers all is not what it seems to be.

Today's Speaker

HOLLISTER STURGES introduced Mr. Mark Contreras, President and CEO of Connecticut Public Broadcasting, who spent 30 years in the newspaper industry with Scripps and Pulitzer publications and several years as Dean of the School of Communications at Quinnipiac University, before joining Connecticut Public Broadcasting. Mr. Contreras began his remarks by citing the decline in U.S. newspaper readership in recent years that has led to the demise of many newspapers, especially local and family-owned newspapers, as well a significant drop in the number of reporters. These conditions, he suggested, have contributed, at least in part, to declining trust in the news and in government; however, he believes there is a real and growing thirst for local news. Connecticut Public Broadcasting's role, as he sees it, is to satisfy that thirst through a focus on local programming and, through its affiliation with national public networks PBS and NPR, the best in national programming. To this end, Mr. Contreras explained Connecticut Public Broadcasting is in the process of expanding its reach into all areas of the state with a current focus on Fairfield County. He noted the installation of new local signal power, recently improved radio reception the length of 195, and the upcoming assignment of eight reporters to the area to illustrate Connecticut Public Broadcasting's growing commitment to comprehensive coverage of topics of interest to Fairfield listeners, including art, science religion, government, children's topics, etc.

Mr. Contreras said listeners' interests are tracked to ensure various interest groups' needs are addressed, and he cited the program, *Report for America*, as evidence that special needs are being met. In response to a question from the audience, Mr. Contreras said that the content of programming on Connecticut Public Broadcasting's 43 platforms remains politically neutral. He noted that listeners are shareholders, and that his company is dependent, in part, on listener contributions.

In concluding his remarks, Mr. Contreras said his goal for Connecticut Public Broadcasting is to make it the one place on the dial listeners will choose for "all-about-Connecticut" stories.
