In the 17th and 18th centuries German citizens and settlers from Germany set up small evergreen trees with lighted candles. Used in Canada as early as 1780, they were still a rarity in the U.S. Then, in England, Queen Victoria and Prince Albert (who was German) introduced the concept there. The practice then came to the US in 1852. Then, in 1853, President Franklin Pierce initiated the tradition of a Christmas tree on the White House lawn. In 1890, the first electric light bulbs were used here. 1931 marked the first Rockefeller Center tree. A beautiful history lesson from **PAUL**.

JERRY SCHWENDEMAN then entertained with a version of "Twas the Night Before Christmas", targeting political correctness. His take home message was "Peace on Earth". So very fitting.
