BILL BURKE, 98, a long-time resident of Greenwich, is survived by his wife Mary, three daughters and a son and their spouses and children. He served in the U.S. Navy in World War II. He graduated from Loyola University, and had a career with Texas U.S. Chemical where he retired at 67 as Vice President, Marketing. He served for 20 more years as volunteer consultant for the National Executive Service Corps. He served as President of the RMA from 1992 to 1993. JOHN PAUL was born in Philadelphia in 1939. He graduated from Cornell Law School, and worked at Bethlehem Steel till 1969. He became VP for Public Affairs with AMAX Coal Co. and later the American Clean Coal Coalition.
