## **TODAY'S SPEAKER**

STEVE MARINO introduced **Jim Bell**, Executive Producer of NBC Olympics, and a Greenwich resident. With the upcoming summer Olympics in Rio, he has been involved with 11 summer and winter Olympics, beginning with the first post-cold war event in Barcelona, Spain in 1992. Jim showed several video clips, including two promos for the

2016 summer event in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, the final moments of the US hockey defeat of the Soviets in 1980, and Bob Costas speaking from Tiananmen Square the morning after the opening ceremonies in Beijing for the 2008 Olympics. Jim explained the difficulties raised by various political events that have complicated and on occasion damaged the Olympics, such as the Munich Olympics in 1972, the US boycott of the Moscow events in 1980, and more recently in 2014 the Sochi, Russia, Winter Olympics when the Ukrainian crisis arose. In answer to a question, he said that the preparations for the Rio Olympics are on schedule but there is still a problem and some concern about the sanitary condition of the waterways for the boating events; special approaches are planned to handle the problem.
