The festivities started with the beloved-ever-popular Melody Men. Conductor TOM HEALY explained that this performance boasted a first, for the first time, the words to their songs would be projected on the wall as an aid to members whose hearing was less than 20-20. The MM sang Christmas songs old and new, inviting the audience to join them in singing the carols. The secular songs, except the finale, *"We Wish You a Merry Christmas*" were performance only.
