TODAY'S SPEAKERS

Mike and Sally Harris, cultural photographers, have made a study of Mennonite and Hutterite communities. The differences between the two are not religious but social.

Both observe Christianity, believe in pacifism and live these beliefs in daily life, the Anabaptist way of life - the simplicity, the emphasis on family and the traditions. Hutterites live in colonies of between 50 and 150 persons, and colonies that grow larger are split up. There is a division of labor; men do the heavy work such as farming and construction while the women take care of cooking, cleaning and making clothing. Meals are taken in a communal dining room with men and women eating separately.
