Greenwich Library has announced that it will no longer fine patrons for overdue materials, effective September 12. The library will remove all fines from current accounts, and there will no longer be any monetary penalties for returning books, movies, or other regular items past their due dates. However, overdue fines will still be charged for late museum passes. This policy change is in line with changes made by many other nationally recognized library systems.

Tog met his wife, Doreen, the love of his life, in college and they were married in 1976. They have four children and now have five grandchildren. A vote was taken and Tog was unanimously elected to RMA membership.

Having passed through Byram hundreds of times over the years, I saw properties and parks I did not know existed. We even walked on streets named Gold, Silver and Nickel and stepped into at least three pocket parks, which are very small parks along the Byram River.

TODAY'S SPEAKER

Following an introduction by **HOLLISTER STURGES**, Jonathan Lemire, an author, journalist and TV host, talked about his latest book, *The Big Lie: Election Chaos, Political Opportunism, and the State of American Politics after 2020*. He traced the origins and persuasiveness of the disinformation that has shaped our current politics and why such a sizable percentage of the American public is willing to believe it and what he believes the consequences are.

Mr. Lemire worked for the *Daily News* for twelve years, then joined the Associated Press as a political reporter in July 2013, eventually covering Donald Trump's 2016 presidential campaign, including his 2015 Trump Tower speech and over 100 campaign rallies across

the country. In January 2017, Lemire became the White House reporter covering all aspects of the Trump administration, national politics, and the federal government, while working between Washington DC and New York City. He presently covers the Biden administration. Jonathan has contributed to multiple MSNBC and NBC shows as a political analyst and is now the bureau chief of Politico and the host of the MSNBC 5 am morning news show, *Way Too Early*.

The lecture by Jonathan Lemire lasted for over one hour. **HOLLISTER STURGES** did a superb job asking Jonathan interesting questions before opening it up to the audience. According to Lemire, "The big lie" started in August 2016 with Donald Trump saying that 2020 was going to be rigged against him. Eventually he said he lost because of mail-in ballots. Lemire believes his character is shameless and that he operates through intimidation and lies. "One could not trust what he says." Mr. Lemire stated that he wrote the book because it is an important story and that Trump has never been challenged previously. He stated that Trump knew that he had lost the day after the election, but went forward with his conspiracy theory. According to Lemire, there was no evidence of fraud found in 63 of 64 lawsuits. This, he said, was confirmed by federal judges, local election officers and certified by VP Pence.

Some other points Lemire made in his book were that 35% to 40% of Americans agree with Trump; and polarization started long ago because many folks are not exposed to alternative points of view. Examples of this are ideological cable channels. On January 6th, the Capitol was breached which was made easier because the guard rails were off and many workers were out sick with covid. Trump received 20 times the media coverage of others because he was the more interesting story. The media was at fault because they often didn't fact check, although Lemire said this is improving.
