The 68th Annual RMA Banquet was held on Wednesday, November 8, 2023, on a brisk but sunny day at the beautiful Tamarack Country Club in Greenwich CT. Members and guests were greeted by at least two of the following members: **PAUL CAMPION, DON CONWAY, JAMES FITZPATRICK, JERRY SCHWENDEMAN and JIM DEAN** as the lead greeter. Name tags were distributed by **ANDY** and Sharon **HOLMES**.

Hors d'oeuvres were served in the anteroom with a fire warming the atmosphere and a panoramic view of the golf course. Food choices consisted of various cheeses, dips, grapes and crackers. There was a cash bar serving beer, wine and liquor. At noon the bell rang for everyone to enter the main dining room for food and presentations. The tables were beautifully decorated with elegant floral arrangements. First Vice President **ARNOLD GORDON** was the master of ceremonies as well as the banquet committee chairman. In addition to **ARNOLD** the banquet committee consisted of **WILL MORRISON**, **ANDY** and Sharon **HOLMES**, Francesca Gordon, **JIM DEAN**, **TONY COCCHI**, **BOB BISHOP**, **LEN CARUSI** and **PETER STERN**.

The invocation was given by **JIM BUTLER**, the Pledge of Allegiance was given by **BOB BISHOP** and the "Star-Spangled Banner" was sung by **TOM HEALY. BOB MORGAN** accompanied on the piano.



ARNOLD welcomed everyone to the 68th Annual Banquet. ARNOLD noted that there are 192 members present and that the RMA is now 240 strong and growing. He told of how the RMA began as the Coffee Hour Club with 13 men on March 10, 1954, initiated by Alfred Lorenz, associate general secretary of the Greenwich YMCA, where all the meetings were held. It wasn't long before they formally organized as the "Retired Men's Association of Greenwich at the YMCA" on October 13 that year, with a constitution and by-laws. The secretary, Ramsy Burton, cut a slot in the top of a wooden cigar box that was passed around at meetings for voluntary contributions. Now you know why we call our meeting minutes the Cigar Box Bulletin or CBB. ARNOLD acknowledged that it takes a team of dedicated people to put this banquet together and that our committee members and others are listed on the back page of the program brochure (copy attached). ARNOLD thanked the 19 table hosts who organized their groups and collected the money. And to JEFF "Money Bags" JUNKER, our busy treasurer, for handling the proceeds and juggling the budget. ARNOLD gave a very special thanks to his co-chair, WILL "Tai Chi" MORRISON, for his creation and ongoing maintenance of a fantastic spreadsheet that captured all we needed to know about every table and attendee. And finally **ARNOLD** acknowledged Karyn Anastasio and her Tamarack staff for their cooperation in accommodating our needs.




RMA Presidents: Our Own Mt. Rushmore

Outstanding Volunteerism Awards

The Volunteer Advocate team made a big difference. **MIKE AMOROSO** and his team of more than a dozen volunteer advocates helped make volunteerism and volunteer opportunities a topic of conversation each Wednesday morning. And they encouraged members to log their contributions. 101 members, 43% of the membership, volunteered and recorded their hours during the 12 months ending in September. This came to a total of 15,225 hours. Many more gave their time but didn't record their hours. 56% of our volunteers supported internal activities, 93 % external programs.

The top three volunteers in support of internal RMA operational activities were **TIM BROOKS**, **BOB RIMMER**, and **JEFF JUNKER**.

The top volunteers in support of external non-profits and projects were **JEFF JUNKER**, **ALAN GUNZBURG**, the late **AV RIVEL** and **MIKE HAYDEN**. **AV** was on pace to be number one.

The top volunteers overall were **JEFF JUNKER, ALAN GUNZBURG,** the late **AV RIVEL** and **BOB RIMMER.**

Of particular interest to the RMA is our support of organizations that in turn support fellow seniors. The past year featured two stand outs.

The Melody Men who performed at over 25 senior residences and other venues during the year and contributed 1,622 hours of their time. **TOM HEALY** accepted the certificate on behalf of the Melody Men.

Call-A-Ride was supported by 16 members with 1,742 hours of their time. This produced more than 3,000 errands completed and doctors' appointments and other essential commitments met. **JEFF JUNKER**, as leading contributor, accepted the certificate on behalf of Call-A-Ride.

ARNOLD then introduced current RMA President JACK WEIR and the Melody Men. JACK then gave the president's message. JACK extended his thanks to ARNOLD and his team for a tremendous job in setting up the RMA Banquet. JACK gave an account of how he came to join the RMA. He spoke of the difficulties in running the RMA during COVID and how the RMA survived during the pandemic through the efforts of a few members especially HORST TEBBE and the implementation of Zoom. He gave credit to HOLLISTER STURGES and BOB MEANEY for their work in organizing the RMA lecture series. JACK also gave credit to the last three RMA presidents (RUSS HARDEN, JOE MANCINELLI and MICHAEL AMBROSINO) for their work in keeping the RMA strong during the pandemic. JACK acknowledged the work done by the scribes on the weekly CBB bulletin. Specifically, TIM BROOKS, BOB SHULLMAN and FRED WU were thanked for their hard work in that regard.

JACK mentioned some of the outstanding issues that still require attention. Among them is parking at FPC for our meetings, reimagining special events and forging new alliances with other non-profits. Lastly continuing efforts to increase membership remains a top priority. JACK ended his remarks praising the RMA as one of the premier groups of its kind in Fairfield County.

The attendees were then treated to an outstanding performance by the Melody Men, led by **TOM HEALY** accompanied by **BOB MORGAN** on the piano.

The Melody Men performed five songs for the crowd. "Oklahoma," "High Hopes," "Cabaret," "Sweet Caroline" and "Nothing Like A Dame." The 68th RMA Annual Banquet came to an end with a rousing rendition of "Till We Meet Again" led by **TOM HEALY.**
