TODAY'S SPEAKER

Donna Spellman, the Executive Director of River House Adult Day Center, will speak on dementia and Dementia Friends a global movement dedicated to helping family, friends, and society to better understand dementia. Donna explained that Dementia is not a disease, but it is an umbrella term for a wide variety of symptoms. She then went on to list ten early signs of dementia, such as memory loss, challenges in planning or problem solving, difficulty in completing simple tasks at home, and confusion regarding time or place. However, she noted

that any one of these in and of itself does not indicate dementia. It is important to recognize that while dementia impacts the short-term memory, the emotional impact of day to day activities still does remain. Therefore, for those interacting with people suspected of dementia it is important to maximize daily interaction and while it may seem like these interactions are quickly forgotten, the happiness of the emotion does remain. River House deals with many dementia clients and they stress kindness and quality of life each and every day.
