TODAY'S SPEAKER

The RMA was truly fortunate to have Page Knox, PH. D. present "Vincent Van Gogh and the Seasons." Page Knox is an adjunct professor in the Art History Department of Columbia University and a lecturer and educator at the Metropolitan Museum of Art. She provided a provocative, educational, and thoroughly enjoyable presentation of Vincent Van Gogh. Through her descriptive analysis accompanied with slides of his work, she touched upon Van Gogh's life, his themes, and the symbolic aspects of his paintings. His art became immensely popular after his early death and as Professor Knox pointed out, he has been mythologized by many as the quintessential tortured artist. Two of his more famous works, *The Potato Eaters* and *The Starry Night* were discussed in her presentation and she identified several films that portray the man and his art.
