ARTHUR STAMPLEMAN invited everyone to attend today's Zoom Webinar speaker program at 11am to hear Dr. Harold Shapiro's talk on "Genetic Engineering: Altering Ourselves and Our Progeny;" see details below. He also described next week's program, a panel discussion on "Greenwich Small Businesses and the Impact of the Pandemic," with accountant Sean Dowling, banker David Moore, restaurateur Caren Vizzo St. Phillip, and retail shop owners Randy and Kimberly Caravella.

SPECIAL EVENTS

No events are currently scheduled and any for the future will depend on the pandemic situation.

SPEAKER PROGRAM

Moderator ARNOLD GORDON welcomed everyone and explained how questions could be asked to the speaker following his completed talk. There were 81 viewers at peak attendance. **ARTHUR STAMPLEMAN** introduced Dr. Harold Shapiro, President Emeritus and professor of economics and public affairs at Princeton University whose current scholarly interests include bioethics, science policy, and energy and climate issues. Among other key positions and honors, Dr. Shapiro served President Bill Clinton's administration as Chair of the National Bioethics Advisory Commission and he received the National Academy's Public Welfare Medal in 2012. In his talk on "Genetic Engineering: Altering Ourselves and Our Progeny," he traced the history of genetics from Darwin to the present day, and the many scientific, religious and ethical controversies now surrounding the use of gene therapy and the potential modifications of the human gene through genetic engineering. Are we in danger of reintroducing eugenics, something used by the Nazis for nefarious purposes, and even in the US early in the 20th century for misguided policies? Should we use the new gene technologies to: avoid or treat disease and disability for our children, even in the embryo state; alter ourselves, as in selecting our offspring? What about long-term effects to future generations and generally to the gene pool?

Of the many possible uses of genetic engineering, Dr. Shapiro believes that Preimplantation Genetic Diagnosis (PGD, test embryos and discard undesirable ones) used with *in vitro* fertilization may be one of the more acceptable applications. It is tempting to believe that we can improve the human species through such promising hereditary manipulations, which seem easier than social and political approaches. However, "its great risk is that it obscures the power of diversity, the beauty of chance and the virtues of tolerance by illusions of perfectibility." The key question as posed by Dr. Shapiro is "whether Genetic Engineering/Therapy somehow represents a boundary (moral or otherwise) which is a 'step

too far'." We do not have the answers!
