Following a rendition of the RMA anthem, President **RUSS HARDEN** opened the meeting at 10:00 AM and called on **DON CONWAY** to lead us in the pledge.

You can register online if you have a driver's license; if not, mail the form to Town Hall, Registrar of Voters, with other proof of identity and residence. Although by mid-September the State will be sending out application forms for all CT residents to request a mail-in ballot, the form is available now:

Print it and you can either mail the completed form to Town Hall or place it in one of the two drop-off boxes in Greenwich. One near the entrance to the Town Hall parking lot and the other just inside the main entrance of the Police Headquarters building (around the corner from the Senior Center). The former place is more convenient relative to parking ability. Please note that although it only says Ballot, according to the Town Clerk the drop-boxes are also for Applications (the boxes are from 2 years ago; they just have not updated them to also say Applications). The actual ballot will be sent to you by the Town starting in early October and it can then be either mailed or placed in one of the drop-off boxes. FYI, CT does NOT require or

use signature verification to match your ballot signature with a reference signature on file (e.g., driver's license, voter registration form).

ALAN GUNZBURG announced that the Town of Greenwich has embarked on a program to make town facilities universally accessible. He is working on this project, and he urges anyone who sees an opportunity to improve access to town facilities to contact him.

TODAY'S SPEAKER

ARTHUR STAMPLEMAN introduced Adam Clayton Powell III, who leads the University of Southern California Cybersecurity Initiative (USCCI). The USCCI was founded about five years ago to focus on how election and political campaign officials can counteract the flow of disinformation and misinformation aimed at undermining U.S. elections. Eight USC schools participate in the initiative, which researches how adversarial agencies (e.g. Russia, China,

Iran) are working to destroy confidence in our elections, and to share their findings with government and others responsible for securing those election. Their work is sponsored by the National Governors Association and Hi-Tech companies, including GOOGLE. Their work products are presentations to state and other agencies, as well as web-based information. Their goal is to present their findings to every state's election management organization, and to-date presentations of their findings have been given to 40 state organizations and over 4,000 participants. Under the motto, "Our Candidate is Democracy," the USCCI is working to inform our election officials of the dangers of cyberspace attempts to disrupt our elections, and to help them counter such attempts.
