SPECIAL REPORT

Mary Hagerty and Fred Decaro III, Voting Registrars for the Town of Greenwich then gave a most enlightening talk on Voting *in the coming election*. The highlights were:

There is a website <u>greenwichct.gov/vote</u> where in you can put your name and get the status of your registration, or your absentee ballot, your polling place and your representatives. <u>Voting in person</u>: A survey after the primaries of 100 voters showed that 95 % felt "safe" or "very safe" voting in person. Since that election, further improvements in protecting voter health have been made.

<u>Voting by mail</u>: Do Not Tarry, apply for your absentee ballot as soon as you get the form, submit your ballot as soon as you receive it. Use the drop box at Town Hall or Police headquarters rather than USPS. Your ballot must be <u>received by</u> 8:00 election day. Be sure to follow all instructions exactly and completely.

PROGRAM COMMITTEE REPORTS

THIS WEEKS SPEAKER

Miles Rapoport, former Secretary of State for CT, currently a Senior Practice Fellow in American Democracy at the ASH Center of the Harvard Kennedy School on

What will the November election look like?

Mr. Rapoport's talk did not cover the issues and personalities involved in November's election, but rather the nuts-and-bolts of the process.

He started by listing the calendar for the election from submitting applications for absentee ballots (already in play), to the vote in Congress to ratify the vote of the Electoral College in January.

He felt that the Virus would cause a heavy load on absentee ballots, and he spent some time on explaining the mechanics of voting and counting the votes. He warned that final results would not be known on Election Day night and maybe not for a week or more. On the other hand, he felt that voting in person is less scary than many thought, as, at least in Connecticut, election officials had learned from the primaries and improved the safety of personal voting. He predicted that turnout would be a record. The 2018 off-year election saw 119 million votes cast, a record for the last decade. He predicted 150 million in 2020.

The main challenges to the vote were discussed. They are extreme polarization, fraud (the issue, not the reality) and voter suppression.

He then revealed some of the mysteries of the Electoral College.

A very spirited RMA Q&A followed.
