Today's Speaker: **BOB RIMMER** introduced Greenwich Library director, Barbara Ormerod-Glynn, who, along with project team leaders Michael Tribe, Tom Heagney and Hank Ashforth provided a comprehensive review of the objectives and status of the ongoing

renovation of the main library. Ms. Ormerod-Glynn offered an overview of how the library will address the changing needs of the community through the re-structuring of the library's three floors to accommodate more group activities through additional meeting facilities, an expanded second floor arts and music space, as well as a newly structured third floor children's space. She also noted that a new café will have indoor and outdoor service and will be managed by a local not-for-profit organization. Mr. Tribe, principal project architect, said the library's new design will express a one building sense where the various sections of the building will be joined by a "colonnaded main street." He also noted that a major feature of the new library will be courtyard access to the new indoor/outdoor café and an expanded Cole Auditorium. Mr. Heagney noted that funding for this renovation is being provided by private, town, state, and federal resources. He and Ms. Ormerod indicated that the newly renovated library will attract 1800-2000 visitors per day – an increase over pre-Covid-19 visits. Mr. Ashforth noted that a key objective during renovation and especially since the outbreak of Covid-19 has been to keep the library open. The project team has been able to accomplish that objective even though syncing labor availability and materials delivery has been challenging. In concluding an informative presentation, Ms. Ormerod-Glynn announced a grand re-opening on the renovated library is schedule for January 28 through February 4, 2021. Save the date.
