Following the martial strains of the RMA song, the meeting was opened at 10:00am by President **RUSS HARDEN**, who immediately segued into the pledge of allegiance led by **ED PARKER**, as Old Glory flapped proudly on our screens. We're getting good at this Zoom stuff!

ANNOUNCEMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS

First on the agenda (and in our hearts) was Corresponding Secretary **ARNOLD GORDON**, who had two announcements. The first, sadly, was that **JACK POOLE**, long time Greenwich resident and RMA member, passed away Sunday evening at Edge Hill. He was 77. **RUSS HARDEN** knew **JACK** well and will prepare a remembrance of him for presentation at a future meeting. Second, **ARNOLD** reminded members that the COVID-delayed payment of Greenwich Town taxes is due tomorrow, October 1st; if mailed, it must be postmarked on or before that date or interest will be charged.

ARNOLD then introduced joke-teller **TOM HEALY**, who regaled us with a story about a drunken man, a priest, and "making sure you understand the question before you answer it."

Always well-organized Membership Chairman **PETER STERN** then announced that there were 73 in attendance on the call. Birthdays (ta-da!) were **MARK GEIMER**, 72, **HORST TEBBE**, 80, **GEOFFREY BURGE**, 63, **BILL HORN**, 87, **BILLY LONDON**, 80, and **GARY MILLER**, 82. The group received a virtual chorus of "Happy birthday to you...," which was somewhat subdued because somebody left most of it on "mute." **PETER** then officiated at the induction of new member, **ALAN BARRY**, who was nominated by **BOB RIMMER**, seconded by **PETER BERG**, and elected to membership by unanimous vote of the attendees. **Dr. BARRY** recently retired as the Greenwich Commissioner of Human Services, after serving in that post for the past ten years. He earned his Ph.D. in Public Policy and Administration from St. Louis University, and has over 35 years of experience in healthcare administration. He was an RMA speaker in February 2020 on the subject of how to break the cycle of poverty in Greenwich. In his brief remarks he looked forward to continuing his engagement with the community through the RMA.

Treasurer **JEFF JUNKER** reported that we are down to 13 members who have not paid their dues or responded to entreaties to do so (how could they!!). We have received refunds for nearly all deposits made for events canceled due to the onset of the COVID pandemic.

PETER UHRY read a touching remembrance of member **ROGER PISANI**, who passed away on September 22nd. The obituary text can be found <u>HERE</u>. The reading was accompanied by a picture of **ROGER**, which led to a discussion of whether the RMA should assemble a library of photos of all its members for such possible use, or other purposes. Others felt that this might be "tempting fate."

MICHAEL AMBROSINO reported that there was no one currently on the Visiting list, but that members should notify him if they knew of anyone who might be so served. **JOHN FEBLES** followed with an announcement about the upcoming Salvation Army Christmas fundraising auction, which will be held virtually this year. SPEAKER PROGRAM

Program Committee Chairman **HOLLISTER STURGES** opened today's session with a preview of future speakers and the procedure to be followed for submitting questions (which will be addressed at the end). He then turned the virtual podium over to **GERALD POLLACK**, who provided biographical background on today's speaker. Hagar Hajjar Chemali is a graduate of Barnard College and Columbia University, and held several senior international policy positions in the George W. Bush and Barack Obama administrations, including Director of Communications for the U.S. Mission to the United Nations, and Director for Syria and Lebanon at the National Security Council. She is a senior fellow with the Atlantic Council's Economic Sanctions Initiative, a commentator on foreign policy issues on MSNBC, CNN, NBC, Fox News, BBC, and Bloomberg, and a self-described "sanctions nerd." She is Founder and Chief Executive Officer of Greenwich Media Strategies, LLC. POLLACK added that her appearance today is in honor of her late friend and RMA member **WIN ADKINS**, who passed away in 2015.

Ms. Chemali's talk was titled "A Closer Look at the Middle East: Key Developments, Insights, and Where Things Are Headed," focusing especially on Iran, Syria, Saudi Arabia and the recent UAE-Israel and Bahrain-Israel peace agreements brokered by the Trump Administration. During the Q&A she also spoke about the situation in Lebanon.
