from Greenwich in more than a century. He was reelected for a second term in 2020. Described by his sponsors as a good guy/regular guy/funny guy/smart guy/empathetic guy who would make a fabulous addition to the RMA, Steve was nominated by **PETER BERG**, seconded by **HOWARD RICHMAN**, and approved unanimously by the membership. 


RUSS HARDEN followed with a eulogy for RMA member Dr. **JOSEPH COLEMAN**, who died on January 27th at the age of 92.



SPEAKER PROGRAM

Beginning at 11:00 am sharp, **HOLLISTER STURGES** introduced the day's featured speaker, Flemming Heilmann, retired business executive, humanitarian, and author of *The Unacceptable Face: Capitalism, Socialism, and National and Corporate Politics*.

Heilmann was born in Malaya in 1936 of Danish parents, and during his international business career was a senior executive of several manufacturing companies, including Metal Box South Africa Ltd., Continental Can Co. (Europe and the U.S.) and American Can Co. In his talk he focused primarily on his 17 years in South Africa, from the 1950s to the 1970s, during which time he witnessed the rise of apartheid, interacted with many government officials, and met opponents including the young Nelson Mandela. He reflected on the interaction between business and government during those tumultuous years, and his later interactions with the increasingly socialist governments in Europe when he ran businesses there, and which in his view crushed free enterprise. During the Q&A he was asked his view of the future of South Africa now that apartheid has ended but many problems remain. His outlook was pessimistic; corruption and poor education, he said, is doing significant damage there. Video of the talk may be accessed through the RMA web site, www.greenwichrma.org
