The next eligible group will include individuals below age 65 who have "certain medical conditions" that increase the risk of complications from COVID-19 infection. Here are some of those qualifying medical conditions: Asthma (i.e., moderate to severe), Cancer, Chronic kidney disease, COPD (i.e., chronic obstructive pulmonary disease), Heart conditions such as heart failure, coronary artery disease, or cardiomyopathies, Hypertension (i.e., high blood pressure), Immunocompromised state (i.e., weakened immune system), Liver disease, Neurologic conditions such as dementia, Obesity (i.e., body mass index of 30 kg/square meter or above), Overweight (i.e., body mass index of 25 to 30 kg/square meter), Pregnancy, Smoking, Type 1 and Type 2 diabetes mellitus. The date for openings for this group has not been set.

#### **TODAY'S SPEAKER**

Today's Speaker: **BOB PHILLPPS** introduced author Steven Ujifusa, whose recent book, *Barons of the Sea: And Their Race to Build the World's Fastest Clipper Ship*, recounts American trade with China in the mid-19<sup>th</sup> century— importation of teas, silks and porcelains paid for by U.S. merchants largely from profits from the sale of opium into China. Mr. Ujifusa introduced members to the major designers and builders of the ships that brought riches to the few who ventured from New England and New York around Cape Horn across the Pacific to China and brought back products much in demand in the United States. Among the leading Clipper Ship Builders, were Donald McKay



and Warren Delano, FDR's grandfather. The three masted Clipper Ships, similar to the picture shown here, made such ventures possible, because they sacrificed capacity for speed that allowed them to bring goods to market faster than other ship types in the first two thirds of the nineteenth century. They travelled at between 15 and 18 knots, and they typically were manned by a crew of about 60 who worked long hours in dangerous conditions. Few passengers travelled on Clipper Ships, because of cost and poor accommodations. The age of the Clipper Ships ended during the 1870s, when ship building began on the U.S. West coast, steam power began to dominate shipping and transcontinental railroads were built. Mr. Ujifusa's interesting presentation offered members insights into a fascinating time in American history.
