

David Pogue

How to Prepare for Climate Change



Maybe you're liberal, maybe you're conservative. Maybe you think the climate crisis is man-made, maybe you don't. Maybe you think the whole thing is a hoax. It doesn't matter. The world is getting hotter and natural systems are going haywire. Most people assume that governments, corporations, and institutions are the only entities capable of dealing with the looming crisis.

In his new book "How to Prepare for Climate Change," New York Times bestselling author David Pogue answers a new question: How can an individual prepare for the coming era of climate chaos? Where to live. How to build. Where to invest. What to eat. What to grow. What to study. How to talk to your kids (and whether to have them). And, as extreme-weather events become more commonplace in every state in America, how to prepare for flooding, wildfire, drought, hurricane, heat waves, and social breakdown. Pogue presents a breath of fresh

air with a practical path forward that's entirely within our control.

David Pogue was the New York Times weekly tech columnist from 2000 to 2013. He's a five-time Emmy winner for his stories on CBS News Sunday Morning, a New York Times bestselling author, a five-time TED speaker, and host of 20 NOVA science specials on PBS.

He has written or co-written more than 120 books, including dozens in the Missing Manual tech series, which he created in 1999; six books in the For Dummies line (including Macs, Magic, Opera, and Classical Music); two novels (one for middle-schoolers); his three bestselling Pogue's Basics, books of tips and shortcuts (on Tech, Money, and Life); his new how-to guides, iPhone Unlocked and Mac Unlocked; and his 2021 magnum opus, How to Prepare for Climate Change.

After graduating *summa cum laude* from Yale in 1985 with distinction in music, Pogue spent ten years conducting and arranging Broadway musicals in New York. He has won a Loeb Award for journalism, two Webby awards, and an honorary doctorate in music. He lives with his wife Nicki and their five children in Connecticut and San Francisco.
