Ransom Wilson Conductor's Choice



Ransom Wilson, the fifth and final candidate for the position of Music Director of the Greenwich Symphony Orchestra will discuss his career as a flutist and conductor. The format will be a conversation with Stephen Boies of the RMA.

Mr. Wilson is a world-renowned flutist, chamber musician, music educator and conductor.

He is a graduate of the North Carolina School of the Arts and the Juilliard School in New York City, where he first met and studied with the world-famous flutist Jean-Pierre Rampal. After Juilliard, Mr. Wilson spent a post graduate year as an "Atlantique Scholar" studying flute with Mr. Rampal in Paris. Mr. Wilson studied conducting with several well-known Maestros and received extensive coaching from the late Leonard Bernstein. Since 1973, he has recorded over 35 albums as flutist or conductor and has three times been

nominated for a Grammy Award. He is the Founder and Conductor of Le Train Bleu in New York City, an ensemble of exciting young musicians who perform the work of contemporary classical music composers. Mr. Wilson has served as a Professor of Flute at the Yale School of Music Since 1991. He is now in his sixth season as Music Director of the Redlands Symphony in Redlands, California. While continually in transit from Coast to Coast and around the World, Mr. Wilson's home base is in currently in Palm Springs, California.

On April 9 and 10, Maestro Wilson will conduct "Dance of the Hours" from the opera "La Gioconda" by Amilcare Ponchielli, "Cello Concerto" by Frederick Delius and Johannes Brahms' Symphony No. 3.
