## **Robert Wolterstorff, Ph.D**

### **“The New Bruce Museum: a World-Class Destination for Art, Culture and Science Education”**

The New Bruce Museum, that just opened on April 2<sup>nd</sup>, has more than doubled the size of the Museum, from 30,000 square feet to 70,000 square feet. The centerpiece of the New Bruce is the Richter wing, a three-story addition that is integrated with the current structure.



"Today, it's about a new building, but it's also about a bigger concept," says Robert Wolterstorff, the executive director of the museum. A new Bruce, a completely re-imagined, re-invented Bruce museum."

The Richter Wing provides community spaces and embeds the Museum in Bruce Park Nature and Community as never before. The new main entrance faces Museum Drive, and the community spaces of the ground floor, entered from the park, are free to visitors. There is onsite dining for the first time, an expanded Lecture Hall, a larger Museum Store, and a Conference Room. Science exhibition and education classrooms will expand to entirely occupy the old museum space.

Over a 27-year career in the arts and museum leadership, Wolterstorff has held curatorial and research positions, most recently at the Bennington Museum in Vermont, and earlier at the Philadelphia Museum of Art, the Clark Art Institute, the Williams College Museum of Art, and the college's Chapin Rare Book Library. He served as a trustee for the New England Museum Association from 2006 to 2015.

Wolterstorff earned a master of fine arts and a doctorate in art history from Princeton University. He has a masters in art history from Williams College and a bachelors in biology from Calvin College in Grand Rapids, Michigan.
